APPEAL FOR WITNESSES

Break-in – Brydekirk

A house recently constructed at Jennys Mill at Brydekirk was broken into sometime between 1600 hours on Thursday 20th and 0900 hours on Friday 21st August. Stolen in the raid were two flat screen televisions.

Break-ins – Dalry/Newton Stewart

Police are investigating two break-ins, one at Dalry and the other at Newton Stewart. The first break-in was at an isolated house just north of St Johns Town of Dalry sometime between Wednesday 19th and Friday 21st August 2009. Household items were taken in the raid. Another break-in took place at an isolated house at Challoch, Newton Stewart, sometime between Friday 21st and Saturday 22nd August 2009. A quantity of ornaments and jewellery were taken in this raid. Police are keen to trace a medium sized white van which was seen in the vicinity of both these break-ins. The van is described as being very clean and without markings.

Vandalisms – Dumfries

A green Vauxhall Vectra car was vandalised while parked in Rosevale Road in Dumfries sometime overnight Friday 21st/Saturday 22nd August 2009.

A silver coloured BMW car has been vandalised while parked in the car park on Mill Road in Dumfries sometime between Thursday 20th and Friday 21st August 2009.

A grey Renault Megane car was vandalised while parked in Caul View in Dumfries sometime between 0200 hours and 1300 hours on Sunday 23rd August 2009.

Vandalism – Newton Stewart

A blue Honda Civic car was vandalised while parked in the car park at the library in Church Street, Newton Stewart sometime overnight Friday 21st/Saturday 22nd August 2009.

Door damaged – New Abbey

The door to the premises at Abbey Cottage Coffees in New Abbey was damaged sometime overnight Friday 21st/Saturday 22nd August 2009.
