APPEAL FOR WITNESSES

Motorbike theft – Kirkmahoe

A black Suzuki 600 motorbike worth over £7000 was stolen from a shed at a house at bridge Cottages at Kirkmahoe sometime between 1855 hours on Friday 2nd and 1855 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2009.

Break-in – Dalry

A break-in has occurred at the Troston estates at Dalry, Castle Douglas sometime between Sunday 13th September and Saturday 3rd October 2009. Two televisions, two video recorders, three digital boxes and a microwave all have been stolen in the raid

Car damaged – Lockerbie

A silver coloured Toyota Corolla car was damaged whilst parked in Tesco's car park in Lockerbie sometime between 1030 hours and 1400 hours on Friday 2nd October 2009. The vehicle which struck and damaged the car failed to stop after the crash.

Sat Nav stolen – Dumfries

A sat nav system has been stolen from a break in to a Toyota Yarns car which was parked in the Royal Bank of Scotland car park in Irish Street in Dumfries sometime between 1600 hours and 1640 hours on Friday 2nd October 2009.

Graffiti – Gretna

Graffiti has been put on walls at a house in Loanwath Road in Gretna sometime on the afternoon on Friday 2nd October 2009.

Windows smashed – Annan

Police want to trace two youths, described as being about 14 years, wearing light coloured hooded tops who were seen near the scene of windows that were smashed at Annan Academy around 1953 hours on Friday 2nd October 2009.

Cars damaged, Dumfries

A silver Vauxhall Vectra car was vandalised while parked in Clarinda Drive in Dumfries sometime around 0030 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2009. Two youths, early 20s, wearing black hooded tops were seen to run from the scene around this time.

A silver Renault Megane car has been vandalised sometime between 1530 hours on Friday 2nd and 0930 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2009 while it was parked in Broomrig Court, Newbridge Drive in Dumfries.

Vandalism – Whithorn

Windows in a greenhouse in Greencroft, Whithorn were smashed in the early hours on Saturday 3rd October 2009.

Vandalisms – Annan

Tractor tyres were slashed and damage has been caused to a trailer and a large quantity of silage bales at Hillend farm at Annan sometime between 2100 hours on Friday 2nd and 0530 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2009. Damage is estimated at just under £5000.

Window smashed – Dumfries

A window at the premises of Envy in English Street in Dumfries was smashed sometime overnight Friday 2nd/Saturday 3rd October 2009.

Car vandalised – Annan

Considerable damage was caused to a grey Mazda car which was parked in the parking area in Longmeadow Avenue in Annan sometime between 1900 hours on Friday 2nd and 0800 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2009. Police want to trace a male who was seen to run off from the car. He is described as being 5' 7 1/2 – 5' 10" tall, slim build, wearing a dark blue parka style jacket with fur around the hood and dark jeans.

Vandalisms – Newton Stewart

Police are investigating a number of vandalisms in the town. Windows were smashed in the Merrick Centre and at Douglas Ewart High School overnight Friday 2nd/Saturday 3rd October 2009. Damage was also caused to a fence in Corsbie Close in the town over the same period.

Break-in Newton Stewart

A house in Reid terrace in Minnigaff was broken into between 1730 hours on Friday 2nd and 1100 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2009. Stolen in the raid were a mobile phone and headphones and cigarettes.

Stereo theft - Dumfries

A stereo was stolen from a silver Ford Ka which was parked in Wallace Street in Dumfries overnight Friday 2nd/Saturday 3rd October 2009.

Lost Insulin – Dumfries

A pink shoulder bag containing personal items and a box of insulin has been lost in the Dumfries area over the weekend. Police warn of the dangers of anyone taking medication that is not prescribed to them.
