Ringing the changes – Dumfries

A case of 'Ringing the changes' took place in the Robert the Bruce public house in Buccleuch Street, Dumfries around 1600 hours on Tuesday 10 November 2009. At that time the following described male attempted to change a large amount of high value notes for smaller notes, and in so doing so caused confusion before changing his mind. When he left the premises it was discovered that over £100 had been stolen. The man is described as being of eastern European appearance, 5' 8" tall, late 30s/early 40s age range, well built, short dark hair, had stubble and a moustache, wearing a dress jacket, shirt and trousers. He spoke in broken English. The man was accompanied by the following three men. 1. Eastern European appearance, well built, older than the main man, collar length dark hair, had a heavy beard and was wearing dark clothing with a suit jacket. 2. Eastern European appearance, skinny build, dark hair and moustache. 3. Eastern European appearance, 6' 4" tall, late 30s/early 40s, thin build, wearing a flat cap.
