### APPEAL FOR WITNESSES

#### **Theft – Kirkton**

A black coloured shopper style bike was stolen from Summervale Cottages at Kirkton sometime between 0930 hours and 1800 hours on Thursday 22 July 2010.

#### **Theft – Moffat**

A Tom Tom sat nav has been stolen from BMW car which was parked in Dundoran View, Moffat, sometime between Tuesday Wednesday 20 and Friday 23 July 2010.

#### **Vandalisms – Dumfries**

A window in a door at a house in Lewars Avenue, Dumfries, was smashed sometime between Tuesday 19 and Friday 23 July 2010.

A double glazed conservatory door at a house in Glencairn Road in Dumfries has been smashed with what appears to have been a golf ball sometime around 1900 hours on Friday 23 July 2010.

A 50cc Rejeu motorcycle was vandalised while parked in the car park behind the Royal Bank of Scotland, Whitesands, Dumfries, sometime between 0830 hours and 1730 hours on Saturday 24 July 2010.

#### **Suspicious Fire – Lochmaben**

Police and the Fire and Rescue Service are investigating the cause of a fire at the Railway Inn in Lochmaben. Around 2340 hours on Friday 23 July 2010 a fire was discovered in the premises. Fire and Rescue Service attended and the fire was extinguished. A joint investigation is underway however early indications point to it being suspicious. No one was injured in the fire however considerable damage has been caused to the building. Police want to hear from anyone who may have been in the area of the Railway Inn on the evening and who may have seen or heard anything suspicious, or anyone who may have any other information about the fire

### **Vandalism – Kelloholm**

All four tyres on a Nissan Primera car which was parked in Anderson Street in Kelloholm were damaged sometime between 0030 hours and 0830 hours on Saturday 24 July 2010.

### **Theft – Dumfries**

Three solar lights have been stolen from the garden of a house in Peveril Court in Dumfries sometime overnight Friday 23/Saturday 24 July 2010.

### **Road Crash – Annan**

Police are seeking witnesses to a road crash which occurred on Stapleton Road in Annan around 0800 hours on Saturday 24 July 2010. At that time a black coloured car, not further described, overtook a cyclist on the road, heading east. After the manoeuvre the cyclist, a 48 year old female, fell from her cycle, sustaining minor cuts and bruising as a result. Police are also appealing for the driver of the black coloured car to come forward.

### **Vandalism – Dundrennan**

A window in a blue coloured Vauxhall Corsa car was smashed sometime between Friday 23 and Sunday 25 July 2010 while parked at East Kirkcarswell Farm, Dundrennan, while the occupants were attending the Wickerman Festival.

### **Theft – Dundrennan**

A wallet containing cash and bank cards and a Spanish guitar and case were stolen from a tent at the Wickerman Site at Kirkcarswell, Dundrennan, sometime 0900 hours and 1320 hours on Sunday 25 July 2010.

### **Suspicious Fire – Dumfries**

Police and Fire and Rescue Service officers are investigating the cause of a fire in Lincluden Church in Margaret Walk in Dumfries. The fire was discovered around 0045 hours on Monday 26 July 2010. The fire was extinguished by the Fire and Rescue Service and no persons were injured. There is however extensive damage to the building. Reports of a number of children being in the area just prior to the fire being discovered are being investigated.
